
## THE 2017 MCKITTERICK PRIZE

## **EMBARGOED UNTIL 20 JUNE 2017 8PM**



The 2017 McKitterick Prize, given to an author over the age of 40 for a debut novel, has been awarded to DAVID DYER for THE MIDNIGHT WATCH (Atlantic Books). The prize of £4,000 was presented by Ben Okri at the Society of Authors' Authors' Awards, held at the Army & Navy Club on 20 June.

The judges this year were Frances Fyfield, Aamer Hussein and Christina Koning. They also commended runner-up AUSTIN DUFFY for THIS LIVING AND IMMORTAL THING (Granta).


