There are more than 45 local groups across the UK and abroad, connecting SoA members, including poets and performers, through regular meet-ups and events. Run by members for members, local groups are a great way to meet fellow authors, share knowledge, support and inspire one another. The SoA's <u>Poetry and Spoken Word Group</u> (PSWG) also aims to hold a minimum of one in-person event per year for SoA members.

### **South West England**

<u>ArtfulScribe</u> ArtfulScribe is a development agency based in Southampton and

supports writers in Hampshire and Dorset through live literature,

workshops, and residencies.

<u>Dialect</u> This writer development platform based in Gloucestershire offers

mentoring, workshops, and retreat opportunities to rural poets.

<u>Literature Works</u> The Writer Development Agency for the South-West. Programmes

include advice surgeries (with a pay what you can policy) and Quay Words, a live literature programme at Exeter Custom House which

also offers a writer-in-residence opportunity.

<u>Lyra Poetry Festival</u> Lyra Poetry Festival runs the Bristol City Poet residency and Bristol

Young City Poet workshops and holds an online and in person

poetry festival every April.

Raise the Bar is the South West's leading live poetry night, running

blockbuster spoken word events in Bristol and beyond since 2014. Raise the Bar also runs artist development activities including

writing retreats, workshops and open mics.

<u>Satellite of Love</u> Monthly open-mic night at the Loco Klub, Bristol.

<u>Tears in the Fence</u> This literary magazine offers online and in-person poetry workshops,

a festival, mentoring, and critical appraisals. (Dorset)

Institute

The Bristol Poetry Institute is run by the University of Bristol's Faculty of Arts and hosts readings, seminars, lectures, conferences and festivals on the subject of poetry. Find them on Facebook,

The Charles Causley
Trust

The Causley Trust offers writing residencies and creative freelance stays to poets and creatives. They also run competitions, host an annual Festival, provide mentoring and internship opportunities.

The Writers' Block

Based in Redruth. Mentoring and skills development for emerging writers and performers. The Writers' Block also hold workshops and readings for poets.

#### **Scotland**

Creative Scotland

Creative Scotland is the public body that supports the arts, screen and creative industries across all parts of Scotland. It offers funding and resources to all kinds of creative practitioners.

I Am Loud

I Am Loud is Scotland's 'premiere spoken word production organisation'. From monthly showcases at the Scottish Storytelling Centre to open mics, tours, and festival performances, I Am Loud's core aim is to support, develop, and make more sustainable the Scottish spoken word scene.

Moniack Mhor

Scotland's Creative Writing Centre offers courses and retreats (bursaries are available), mentoring, writing support, workshops and events.

Rock the Boat

Push the Boat Out's monthly open-mic night. Push the Boat Out also runs online writing workshops.

The Scottish Book
Trust

A national charity that offers resources, fellowship and grants for writers, including funding for live events. It also maintains a database of creative practitioners available for projects and events (<u>The Live Literature Directory</u>). They also maintain a <u>list of Spoken Word Events</u> across Scotland.

The Scottish BPOC
Writers Network

Scottish BPOC Writers Network (SBWN) is a professional development and advocacy group for Black writers and writers of colour who are Scottish, Scotland-based or have strong links with Scotland.

The Scottish Poetry Library The Scottish Poetry Library has a programme of poets and provides a rich resource of poetry, contacts and events.

### **Wales (National)**

#### Barddas

Barddas is a society which promotes understanding and appreciation of poetry in Welsh, the use of cynghanedd, and supports writers, including young poets. It has a quarterly magazine, publishes books, and advances its aims via different schemes, including a popular contribution to the National Eisteddfod, an annual festival called Gŵyl Gerallt, and various competitions.

# <u>Llenyddiaeth</u> <u>Cymru/Literature Wales</u>

Llenyddiaeth Cymru/Literature Wales supports literature and writers across genres in both languages. It runs a limited one-to-one mentoring scheme, has a directory where writers can add their details, controls the Ty Newydd writers' centre and offers limited part-funding for some literary activities.

#### Talwrn y Beirdd

Radio Cymru runs Talwrn y Beirdd ('talwrn' = cockpit for cockfighting) where teams from all over Wales compete in a knockout competition. They are given bardic tasks in strict metre and free meters by the MEURYN (the judge) and they record these programmes in chapel vestries/halls etc all over Wales and audiences attend. Very popular events with a good cross-section of team members (age and gender-wise). The final is held/recorded in the National Eisteddfod every year, and local Talwrn groups have sprung up in several places.

### Wales (Local)

<u>Spoken Word Wales</u> (<u>online</u>) Online resource for poets looking for live events in Wales, with lists of open mic events and venues.

#### Swansea & District Writers' Circle

Swansea & District Writers' Circle meets monthly in the Taliesin Arts Centre and online. It has a poetry group, a prose group, runs workshops, socials, and competitions and has a programme of guest speakers open to all to attend.

## Wales (Local) contd.

<u>Ysgol Farddol</u> <u>Caerfyrddin</u> Ysgol Farddol Caerfyrddin (Carmarthen Bardic School) have been meeting for over 20 years. There are similar groups in Caernarfon, Cardiff and south Cardiganshire.

# National / Non-region specific Organisations

<u>Arvon Foundation</u> Established creative writing organisation that runs courses and

retreats.

<u>Mslexia</u> is 'a bestselling quarterly magazine for women who write -

with every issue offering paid submission spots for poets'. As well as the magazine, they run an annual poetry competition and their

'Salon' membership offers weekly write-ins, talks and workshops.

National Centre for

**Writing** 

The <u>National Centre for Writing</u> is a national and local writing development agency based in Norwich, offering mentoring,

workshops and events for writers of all kinds.

National Poetry Centre exists to provide a national home for

poetry in the UK - connecting people from all backgrounds and cultures to poetry. Its Leeds headquarters will be a hub for poetry awards, events, major performances, exhibitions, workshops, openmic nights, a library, collections and archives - but the charity is already delivering a programme of work, locally, nationally and

internationally.

<u>Poetry School</u> National arts organisation providing inspiring tuition and

opportunities for poets and poetry audiences through workshops

and longer courses. (Some bursaries available.)

and internationally, offering workshops and events to authors. The Society facilitates regional poetry critique groups called <u>Stanzas</u>

which run across the UK.

### **Groups working across languages**

#### **Exiled Writers Ink**

Exiled Writers Ink develops and promotes the creative literary expression of refugees and migrants, increases their representation in the mainstream literary world, develops cross cultural dialogue and advocates human rights and social justice through literature and literary activism. Their work includes a monthly Exiled Lit Cafe, creative writing workshops, live literature performance events, mentoring, translation, publications and symposia.

#### <u>La Tundra Revista</u> and London Spanish Book & Zine Fair

La Tundra Magazine organises creative writing, poetry and drama workshops in Spanish (online and in person), presentations of books and live interviews and a book fair. The London Spanish Book & Zine Fair (LSBZF) which comprises an exhibitors' fair, presentations and workshops.

#### <u>Poetry Translation</u> <u>Centre</u>

Organisation dedicated to translating and promoting contemporary poetry from Africa, Asia and Latin America. Runs programmes, events, workshops and some development schemes.

#### Spanish and Latin American Poets (SLAP)

A group of poets and writers from Latin America and Spain, who live in the UK. The group offers cultural and literary workshops and conferences. See SLAP Group on Facebook for more.

#### Un Nuevo Sol

A collective of British Latinx and UK-based writers of Latin American heritage who meet regularly and have published anthologies and held many readings, literary cafes and salons. The organisation offers workshops, mentoring, tutoring, publishing, readings, salons, etc.
